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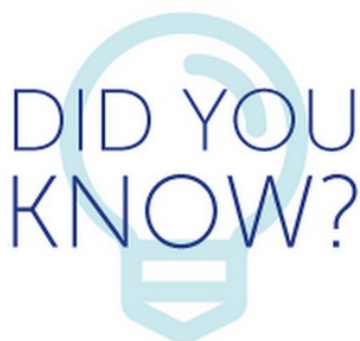
From AL.com: Are Alabama's high school graduates ready for the next step?
